The Restriction of Hazardous Substances in Electrical and Electronic Equipment (RoHS) Directive 2002/95/CE was passed into law by the European Union, effective July 1, 2006 and replaced by Directive 2011/65/UE (RoHS 2), effective January 3, 2013. It defines a group of ten compounds as restricted hazardous substances in electronic equipment. These are: lead, mercury, cadmium, hexavalent chromium, polybrominated biphenyls (PBB), polybrominated diphenyl ethers (PBDE), Bis(2-ethylhexyl) phthalate (DEHP), Butyl benzyl phthalate (BBP), Dibutyl phthalate (DBP, Diisobutyl phthalate (DIBP). TPS has been actively working to comply with RoHS. TPS believes that its products which are put on the market in the European Union meet the applicable requirements of RoHS in those jurisdictions which have adopted RoHS or a version thereof.
